### **For Immediate Release:**

On Saturday, December 21, 2013, at 2:00 p.m. Gibson County Central Dispatch received a call of a Silver 2006 Chevy Equinox stuck in approximately 3 feet of water. Gibson County Deputies, Fort Branch Fire, and Gibson County were dispatched to the scene. Upon arriving the Fort Branch Fire Department asked for assistance of a local farmer and his tractor to reach the stranded vehicle. The driver Joel L. Anable age 54 of Princeton was brought to dry land and after being stranded for approximately one hour. During an investigation into the incident Deputy Speedy smelled the strong smell of an alcoholic beverage on Mr. Anable's person. After administering the standard field sobriety tests and a portable breath tests Mr. Anable was transported to the Gibson County Jail where he was charged with Operating a Vehicle While Intoxicated. Mr. Anable remains in custody on a \$650 bond.
